**Rowan Nicks Russell Drysdale Fellowship in Australian Indigenous Health and Welfare**

The fellowship shall be awarded under the following conditions:

1. The purpose of the Fellowship is to train potential workers and leaders in Australian Indigenous Health and Welfare.
2. The Fellowship may be awarded by the Dean of the Faculty of Medicine to Australian citizens or permanent residents who wish to undertake approved projects/activities; or further training/education; or a research program, approved by the Advisory Committee.
3. Preference will be given to projects or training which have support from an Indigenous community.
4. All items on the application form must be completed to ensure applications are considered.
5. The Fellowship will be awarded for a period of up to 12 months. Under exceptional circumstances and subject to the availability of funds and the approval of the Advisory Committee, the Fellowship may be extended up to a further 12 months.
6. A stipend and incidental expenses will be payable as determined by the Dean after consultation with the Advisory Committee.
7. The Fellow may conduct his/her work in any location in Australia as approved by the Dean of the Faculty of Medicine after consultation with the Advisory Committee. The Dean will appoint a person to supervise the work of the Fellow.
8. At the end of the initial appointment of the Fellowship and on completion of the Fellowship, the Fellow must provide a written report to the Advisory Committee.
9. Fellows are encouraged to present their work, for example, at seminars, conferences and in community settings.
10. All publications arising out of the work undertaken during tenure of the Fellowship must include appropriate acknowledgement of the contribution of the Fellowship.
11. Subject to availability of funds more than one Fellowship may be awarded concurrently.
